Getting here

Directions to the conference

The conference is to be held at the Stripe Lecture Theatre Complex on the King Alfred Campus at the University of Winchester. The full address for the University of Winchester, Kings Alfred Campus, is

As might be expected for a conference on climate change, public transport is the preferred mode of transport to attend the event.

By train

The King Alfred Campus is less than one mile (approximately 15 minutes walk) from the railway station. Leave the railway station by the main exit and turn right into Station Road leading into Upper High Street. Turn right over the bridge and left into Clifton Terrace. Cross Romsey Road and walk along St James Terrace. At the end of the terrace turn to your right and cross the road. Then follow the path through the middle of West Hill Cemetery (note: do not take the path to the left of the cemetery). The University is situated opposite the far gate of the cemetery.

A conference courtesy mini bus will be operating from the station to the venue. Please e-mail us if you wish to reserve a seat (not compulsory, but it does help us)

Bus and coach

Main bus and coach routes stop at King Alfred's Statue in central Winchester. The walk to King Alfred Campus takes approximately 20 minutes. On alighting proceed along Broadway and through the pedestrianised High Street. Turn left at Southgate Street. Cross St Clements Street and take the next right turn into St James Lane. Proceed up the hill and just after the railway bridge go through the gates of West Hill Cemetery and take footpath through the middle of the cemetery. The University is situated opposite the far gate of the cemetery.

By car

If travelling by car, visitors should approach Winchester along Romsey Road. If driving from the M3, come off at junction 11 and pass through Badger Farm Road and turn right at the second roundabout to proceed along Romsey Road. After passing the West Downs on your left and the Royal Hampshire County Hospital on your right, turn right into St James Lane. After a sharp corner turn right into Sparkford Road. The King Alfred Campus is halfway down the hill on the right hand side. Please follow signs for the **Dytche student parking** which is where delegates are being asked to park, on a free of charge basis, whilst the conference is on.

We would strongly suggest that you download this [map](#) of the King Alfred Campus, as the map is very clear and should prevent anyone from getting lost.

On the day

When you arrive at the campus, please take your car to the Dytche car park, which is directly behind the Stripe conference centre. Make your way to the Stripe, and go to the registration desk in the foyer.

You will be issued with a parking permit for that day, which you will need to put in your car before you enter the conference. You will also be given a name badge and a delegate pack, which will include full details of the day.

Please allow at least 20 minutes to park, register, and return to your car in order to display your parking permit, and then return to the Stripe in time to pick up a tea or coffee, prior to the conference starting.

Lunch will be at 12.30, and will be a buffet. Teas and coffees will be provided throughout the day. Tea and coffee will be available on arrival from 9am, and we look forward to seeing you then.
